

Star Wars - Queen Amidala

According to the make-up artist who created this unique look for '*Star Wars, The Phantom Menace*', Queen Amidala's make-up was inspired by the Japanese Kabuki style. Colours are similar to those recommended for the Geisha.

We recommend:

Aquacolor in White #70,
Ivory or Porcelin #406
Black eyeliner pencil
Bright Red Lip pencil
Mascara if necessary.



Technique:

- Cover the entire face to the hairline with white base using a damp sponge. Kryolan Aquacolor is recommended as it provides a soft powder finish.
TIP: Ivory will provide a shade that will not make the eyes look too red – this is the actual shade that was used in the movie.
- Red spots on the cheek can be applied with red lip pencil.
- The same colour should be used on the lips – cover the entire top lip and on the centre section of the bottom lip. Use white base colour on either side of the red mark on the bottom lip.
- Softly outline the eyes with black or brown eyeliner.
- Eyebrows should be subtly sculpted in black or brown pencil.
- Apply mascara if necessary.

TIPS & TRICKS: Water based make-up is recommended for low impact activities and short term wear. Aquacolor dries to a powder finish, buff away excess powder with a dry make-up brush or soft towel. When dry, Global has a soft matt finish and does not transfer colour or powder to clothes. Washes off with soap and water. For high impact activities such as stage performance, (or simply partying all night) grease-based make-up will last longer and give denser coverage. Set with powder and buff the excess with a dry make-up brush or towel. However, please consider that grease make-up can stain fabrics and should be removed with make-up remover.
