

BEETLEJUICE!

We Recommend:

Aquacolor White #70.
 Kryolan Aquacolor
 Grass Green #36.
 Kryolan Aquacolor
 Black #71 or
 Global Body Art/Grease Sticks.
 Black eyeliner pencil.
 Small sponge with one flat sharp edge.
 Brush and Course Stipple Sponge.

TECHNIQUE:

- Using the flat sponge or a brush, rinse and squeeze out excess water, apply the base colour (white) to all exposed areas of the face, ears and neck, except around the eye sockets and the lips. Do not apply too thickly – skin tone should be visible.
- Using the eyeliner pencil, draw a line around the eye socket and just above the line of the eyebrows. (Note: Michael Keaton has naturally evil eyebrows – if you don't, draw a peak above the brows, in line with the outer corner of the socket.) Fill with black, but be careful when applying colour around the eyes.
- Using the stipple sponge, dab green colour from the hair line towards the face (this guy has been dead so long he's going mouldy!) Don't forget to include the ears, around the back of the neck and a small amount at the corner of the mouth.
- Clean the stipple sponge in warm soapy water, squeeze dry and load up with black colour. Dab lightly around the jaw and neck for a fetching five o'clock shadow. Do not rub or you will smear the stipple effect. Set with a light dusting of talcum powder if using grease based make-up.
- For Lydia (Beetlejuice's Bride) use pale skin coloured foundation, grey and red eye shadow and mascara.



TIPS & TRICKS: Water based make-up is recommended for low impact activities and short term wear. Aquacolor dries to a powder finish, buff away excess powder with a dry make-up brush or soft towel. When dry, Global has a soft matt finish and does not transfer colour or powder to clothes. Washes off with soap and water. For high impact activities such as stage performance, (or simply partying all night) grease-based make-up will last longer and give denser coverage. Set with powder and buff the excess with a dry make-up brush or towel. However, please consider that grease make-up can stain fabrics and should be removed with make-up remover.
